Over the last 3 months a total of 590 appointments have been wasted by patients not attending their appointments. If you are not able to make your appointment please contact us to cancel it. These appointments can then be used by other patients.

In June we saw a Total of 5,249 patients 4942 of these appointments were carried out face to face in the surgery.

307 were carried out over the telephone.

During July we saw 5461 patients

5045 of these appointments were carried out face to face in the surgery

416 were carried out over the telephone.

We understand that the demand for appointments is high. We have put measures in place to help with this.

We have opened up appointments for this years flu vaccine Please contact us or pop in to our reception to make an appointment.

Please see below the eligibility criteria

are aged 65 or over (including if you will be 65 by 31 March 2024)

- have certain long-term health conditions
- are pregnant
- Live in a care home
- are the main carer for an older or disabled person, or receive a carer
- Live with someone who has a weakened immune system.

Frontline health and social care workers can also get a flu vaccine through their employer.

Most children can get the children's flu vaccine. This includes children who were aged 2 or 3 years on 31 August 2023, schoolaged children (Reception to Year 11) and children with certain health conditions.

Test Results

Once you have had a blood test most results can take approximately 2-5 working days to come back to the Surgery although some results can take several weeks.

RSV Vaccine

The RSV vaccine helps protect against respiratory syncytial virus (RSV), a common virus that can make babies and older adults seriously ill. It's recommended during pregnancy and for adults aged 75 to 79.

What the RSV vaccine is for

The RSV vaccine helps protect against <u>respiratory syncytial virus (RSV)</u>. RSV is a common cause of coughs and colds. Most people get it several times during their life. It usually gets better by itself, but in some people (especially babies and older adults) it can cause illnesses such

pneumonia (a lung infection) bronchiolitis (a chest infection that affects babies)

These illnesses can cause serious breathing problems. They may need to be treated in hospital and can be lifethreatening. Getting RSV can also make your symptoms worse if you have a lung condition, such as chronic obstructive pulmonary disorder (COPD). The RSV vaccine helps reduce the risk of serious breathing problems like pneumonia and bronchiolitis.

Who should have the RSV vaccine

The RSV vaccine is recommended if:

- you're pregnant the vaccine is recommended during every pregnancy (from 28 weeks onwards) to help protect your baby after they're born
- you're aged 75 to 79

If you're aged 80 or over

- If you turned 80 on or after 1 September 2024, you're eligible for the RSV vaccine until 31 August 2025.
- You're not eligible for the RSV vaccine if you turned 80 before 1 September 2024.


